AST Level 1 - Avalanche Skills Training Level 1 – Canadian Avalanche Association Course Curriculum


The 16 hr+ AST1 is the minimum recommended course for all people that enjoy the mountains in the wintertime. Among other things you will learn:

- 4 persistent weak layers and what you can do to avoid them
- 8 killer terrain features
- the 5 most important questions to ask when organizing a rescue
- why your long time local knowledge of a riding area isn't enough to keep you safe
- your snowmobile can be a tool or it can be a weapon. Learn to use its power to your advantage
- why the blueprint changes season to season, even from day to day. What is this year's blueprint?
- why rocks and trees are like icebergs
